















From the President's desk!

....WELCOME TO 2019

and a significant time for the Frankston RSL. I hope you have all had a healthy and restful Christmas period as the summer progresses.

This year will be an exciting one with much celebration for the Centenary of the Frankston RSL. These celebrations are to acknowledge the servicemen and women who formed and developed the club, along with those community members who have continued to support our veterans by volunteering in many areas.

In November our band of volunteers from all sections of our membership, took their turns at shopping centres within the region to raise the incredible amount of \$58,319.60. We thank those volunteers, and seek any new members who may wish to help with a little time to raise money to assist veterans.

All of the funds raised, plus some, are spent on assisting veterans. This has increased since the Southern Peninsula Veterans Hub at Rosebud relocated to Frankston, to form the Peninsula Veterans' Hub. This is a pilot program under the guidance of ANZAC House up until July 2019, which has generated an increase in welfare spend. As we draw veterans in to assist with Advocacy claims we are finding more and more need for welfare assistance.

During my time as both Secretary and President we have seen an increased interest in our commemoration services held on ANZAC Day and Remembrance Day, from having a few hundred attend outside the council chambers, to 15,000 at the dawn service held at the Frankston Football oval in 2015. Whilst we have not

maintained that enormous figure, we still have many thousands attending these services. With the Centenary of ANZAC Services, and the development of the new War Memorial, council saw fit to provide staff and funding to make this community event a great time of commemoration for all. At the time of writing this report I am saddened to advise that the Frankston City Council have rescinded all financial support, and after 2020 all in kind support as well. I will keep you posted on the outcomes, but be assured we will continue to commemorate our veterans' service to the nation and our community.

It would appear the club has seen stable management and growth over the years, and I acknowledge the executive members who have nurtured this club to success, including 38 Presidents, 28 Secretaries and 30 Treasurers. On that note you would be aware our Annual General Meeting is coming up on the 17th March and there is a position vacant for Treasurer. It was with regret that in January I accepted the resignation of our Treasurer Peter Bromley. Peter has been an active member of the club for many years through the golf club, and for the last 8 years steered our accounts into the 21st century as Treasurer. His accounting acumen has been a great asset to the club and we thank Peter for his outstanding work and diligence.

We would welcome any member who has accounting or business management experience, and would like to be involved in the ongoing success of the club, to nominate for the position of Treasurer. For further information please speak to the President or Secretary.

In discussing positions on the committee, we welcome Kelvin Park, President of the Frankston Vietnam Veterans' Association of Australia who has been nominated by your committee to fill the current vacant committee position. We look forward to his input and assistance as we move forward in an ever changing climate of governance and veteran support.

Combined with the celebrations are some new developments around the club. This has been a painstaking process of putting together ideas to ensure the ongoing success of the business. Our General Manager Rob, and Operations Manager, Annemaree, in conjunction with the committee, have spent many hours pouring over plans and processes to finally have paperwork submitted for a Building Permit from council. The design and development is to make an enjoyable experience for all attending the venue, and in so doing will require changes for some internal organisations which have enjoyed the provision of space and assets for many years. This is all an endeavour to utilise the maximum space for the maximum members. The extent of renovations to be carried out for your benefit will be revealed at the AGM.

Finally, as a lead in to the centenary celebrations I am looking forward to having afternoon tea with three of our members who are either 100 years old (102) or about to turn 100. We look forward to celebrating together.

WELLBEING AND COMMUNITY

Since our last featured article on our new initative, the Peninsula Veterans' Hub, I am pleased to report that our numbers continue to swell as the words gets around and also, with the help of Tony, our Facebook presence is reaching out as far as the USA with some glowing reports and quality feedback. Whilst many are not Facebook fans this is now the medium that so many use to communicate especially our younger veterans and their families.

We have also been working closely with our ANZAC House counterparts to ensure that along with the emerging Hub at Warrnambool the RSL is well placed for a mid-2019 full transition of the Hub Concept with both operational and funding models as we move forward to the next generation of support.

We have also had a slight "course correction" with Welfare now being replaced with Wellbeing as some see the word Welfare with some stigma attached to it.

The Frankston operation now has 4 Compensation and two Wellbeing Advocates available to assist any in need with the complexities of recent legislation and the often-complex Transition Process for our ADF members and their families.

Whilst we strongly support our current ADF Members we also have a strong connection to our emerging ADF members via our links with the three Cadets units on the Peninsula with TS Tingira based out of HMAS Cerberus training future RAN members, 406 Sqn AAFC looking after our RAAF and 36 ACU Unit our Army.

All three Cadet Units are strong supporters of both our Appeals (ANZAC and Poppy) making a significant contribution to our totals. In return we support these Units both financially and morally with attendance at their formal "Dining In" Functions and Parades.

In November and December, we attended both the Navy Dinner at Rosebud RSL and the Air Force End of Year parade and again all were tested by the Cerberus weather extremes with the exception of the Cadets and their flawless drill and all with four seasons in one hour.



These activities clearly demonstrate our crossover support for all Cadets who also assist with our Commemorative Events.

In addition to the above and unbeknown to some is that many of our Volunteers wear more than one hat and in addition to Appeals and such Wellbeing is still the core of our mission.

Advocate Tony is still most active with his passion for Mobility Aids for those in need.





As we farewelled 2018 Hub staff gathered for a "Thank you" luncheon for all the Hub supporters and Volunteers.


