Melanie Cotta won the A grade netball best and fairest. She is a club stalwart.



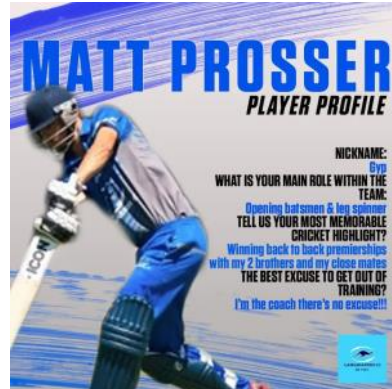
