elcome to the chilly spring edition of Morse Code.

The winter months have seen a lot of changes around the club, and we have been busy setting new goals for the future.

Whilst we were sad to see our Operations Manager Annemaree move on after 28 years of service with the Frankston RSL, we welcome her replacement Colin Ross who will have big shoes to fill. Shortly after Annemaree's departure our Executive Chef also moved on to a new role working on large scale events, and we have since had Dean Webster join the Team as Executive Chef; he last worked at the Ringwood RSL for 16 years and Valentinos in Heathmont. Finally, and as if we hadn't had enough changes, General Manager Rob Morrison retired after 16 years at the helm of the Club and was replaced by Brett Rowlands who comes to us with prior RSL experience working at both the Seaford and Rosebud RSL.

Throughout these changes the committee have soldiered on and remained intact, overseeing much happening in the Wellbeing space.

We continue to expand our relationship with ANZAC House and Veterans Central in the provision of advocacy to our veterans. These activities are overseen by Ange who works for ANZAC House but is based at the Frankston RSL in the Veteran's Hub. The Branch's own Wellbeing and Pastoral Care is overseen by Stellar, Frankston RSL Wellbeing Coordinator, who works alongside Ange at the Veteran's Hub. Between Ange and Stellar, and the Wellbeing Committee that answers to the Sub-Branch committee, there have been a lot of inroads into concerns of social isolation, the wellbeing of veterans, and providing Pastoral Care for those in need. We have also been able to provide our affiliate members with advice and assistance if required.

The Wednesday and Friday coffee mornings are seeing a lot of veterans catching up for a chat and putting forward suggestions to make the world 'all right' again.

While there are a lot of volunteers who do great work around the club we are always seeking new faces. Each "Appeals" we are finding more difficult to fill positions, as our regular volunteers are getting older and less able to assist. The funds raised at these appeals aid veterans in need. If you can spare the time, it would be wonderful to have new faces and extra pairs of hands to help the Appeals team out when we start work on the Remembrance Day Appeal.

There are also positions available for younger veterans, especially those who may have recently left the services, to help with the provision of Wellbeing services to veterans. Contact Stellar on 0492 820 743 if you are able to help with these services or are keen to volunteer with our Appeals.



July 2022 saw the Changing of the Guards at the Frankston RSL. It was a challenging month with the foreboding departure of Rob Morrison as General Manager of The Frankston RSL. After 53 years of service to the Hospitality industry, of which the last 16 were at the helm of the Frankston RSL.

The RSL owes Rob a world of gratitude for his passion, drive, and commitment to the club and for leaving it in the best financial shape it has ever been, and the most successful and best run version of the business to date.

In 2016 he was awarded Honorary Life Membership of the Returned Services League of Australia for his outstanding support of not only the Sub-branch but the League within Victoria with his involvement in Committees within ANZAC House for the betterment of all sub-branches.

He took the club to the pinnacle within the RSL Network, and racked up a variety of accolades;

- RSL Victoria Licensed Branch of the Year 2012 & 2015
- RSL Victoria Certificate of Achievement of the year 2015
- Hall of Fame inductee 2015
- Highest increase in annual memberships by a Sub -Branch 2015
- General Manager of a Sub-Branch of the year 2012 & 2015

In his tenure, Rob saw out three Committee Presidents, four Secretaries, five Treasurers, and 27 Committee members.

He was the driving force behind a plethora of programs and events at the Frankston RSL such as

Wednesday and Friday Night Raffles and Member's Draws, the much anticipated four week long Christmas Raffles, 2 for 1 Monday and Tuesday nights, Cracked Pepper themed Food Nights, and the much loved Cash for Splash and Car Giveaway.

Some called him the numbers man, passionate and driven by his spreadsheets, by the time he retired, the Club was running optimally, smoothly, and was eight times more successful than when he began and provided members with great service, food and beverage options and first class shows.

It's with this same drive and passion he supported local sporting clubs, community groups, and charities. We are indebted to Rob for his commitment to Veterans and Welfare groups, with initiatives such as the 'Hello Program', and the charities he supported such as Very Special Kids. If there was an appeal Rob was behind it - raising valuable funds and giving back to victims of flood, fire, and other disasters. He was the instigator of many initiatives, such as free Family Fun days, Centenary Year Celebrations, and the magnificent and various renovations and works the venue underwent, and that he oversaw, that we can all enjoy. Rob undoubtably leaves a legacy that will be hard to beat.

We will miss his infectious laugh, his outstanding microphone skills, his love of fancy dress, and his gift of the gab but most of all we'll miss his passion, drive, and commitment to the Frankston RSL, it's members, community, and Veterans.

He held a myriad of positions at the Frankston Sub-branch and Victorian Branch throughout the vears including President Frankston RSL 1950-1968, Vice President Victorian Branch 1964-1968. 1975-1979 and Senior Vice President 1975-1979. He was also the recipient of the Gold Badge - the RSL's highest award for rendering outstanding service to the League, exservice personnel, or their dependants.



Frankston RSL and Wallara's Sages Cottage Farm is a wonderful community partnership that continues to grow and thrive as a result of the wonderful support provided through the community grants program that has enabled the farm to create more employment pathways and increase its growing capacity.

The horticulture poly tunnel has clients propagating a range of plants that are sold at the Sages stall at the Mornington Street Market. The tunnel also houses an aquaponics system, that produces vegetables and herbs for the menu at Sages Café.



Through a further grant, the farm is about to install a Biofilta system to expand the horticulture precinct by a quarter acre with garden beds that will increase the visual appeal of the area. The 10 garden beds can produce 720 kgs of produce per annum, minimising purchases, providing fresh animal feed, and increasing the volume of produce for our retail outlets. The systems are environmentally friendly, accessible and easy to maintain.



With Wallara opening the farm and café 7-days a week from early 2023, this grant will create more employment pathways and work opportunities for our clients and have the farm well on its way to delivering more delicious farm to plate menu items – breakfast, lunch

and dinner, that we can all enjoy. Stop by and visit Sage's Cottage Farm and stay on for a coffee or a bite and meander through the gardens.


FRANKSTON RSL BILLIARD ROOM NAMING
