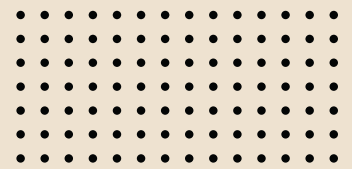

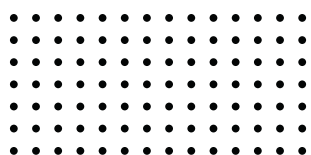

Roles of the Committee will be determined by the Committee at the first Committee meeting after the Election.

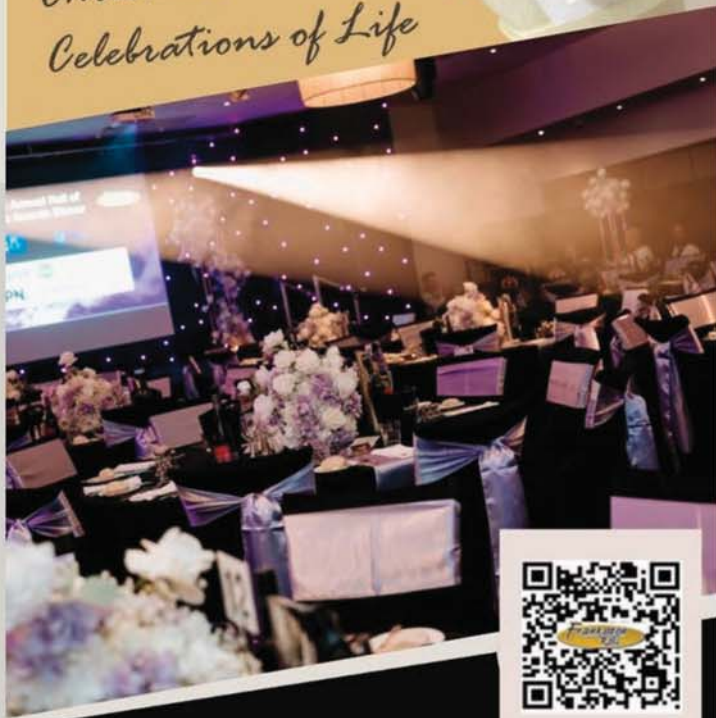

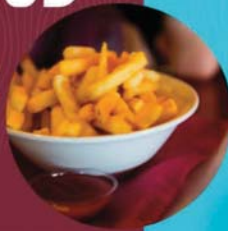

The Frankston RSL received the Sub-Branch Commendation Award, one of the six awards of the night.



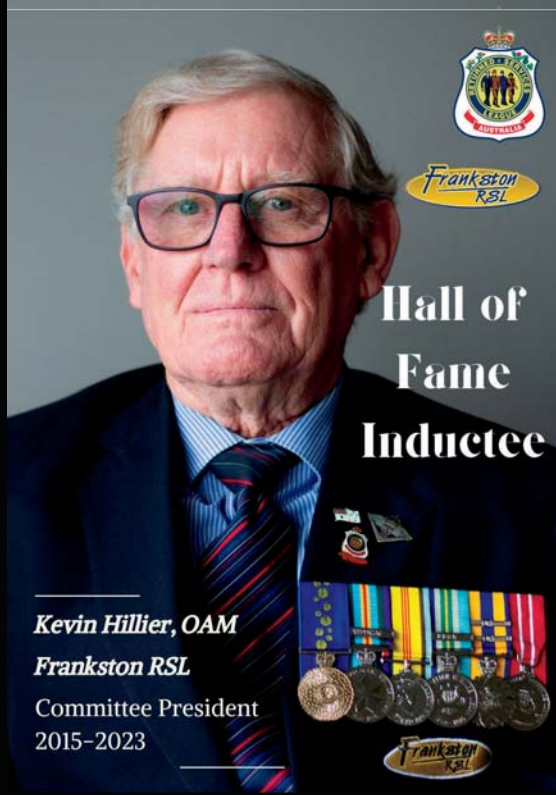

CONTRIBUTION TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE FRANKSTON RSL AND THE RSL NETWORK

Veterans & Families Wellbeing Hub Conception to Implementation

Kevin provided support to Anzac House with the transition of the Frankston Veteran Hub into the new Regional Anzac House Veteran Well-being Hub, including the appointment of a Wellbeing Officer, and a Regional Case Navigator. Kevin was a key player in ensuring the centre is more inclusive to all veterans and their families, than historically, welcoming all groups within the veteran community; sub-groups who regularly make use of the club for meetings, coffee mornings, and group lunches, as well as our RSL sporting groups who also utilise the facility for committee meetings, and liaising with local council.

As Veterans Central became established at ANZAC House, Kevin became more involved with the new processes involved in the provision of wellbeing and advocacy to our veterans. As a result, the RSL Advocate, Pension Officers, and several

Welfare and Wellbeing Officers all work at the Veterans Centre which is now regarded as a 'Hub' - permanently housing paid compensation advocates, a manager, and our own Frankston RSL Wellbeing Coordinator.

As a "Hub" this has grown over the last few years. Kevin has close communication with the team at ANZAC House, including the social worker at VETCEN into each of the Wellbeing meetings via ZOOM to receive expert advice in areas that our Wellbeing Advocates are not experienced in, for the benefit of our veterans.

Kevin spearheaded the naming of the Hub to 'Veterans and Families Wellbeing Hub', after the former President of the Frankston RSL Sub-Branch - Dr. John Finch Akeroyd, AM, MBE, ED, MB, BS, FRACP, FACRM. Additionally, he executed the idea of the 'Table for the missing' as part of the Anzac Day 2022 Commemorative Service. It was a focal point of the luncheon after the Commemorative Service.

SERVICE

Life Member

As a life member of the RSL, and President of the Frankston RSL Committee, Kevin has devoted over 26 years of outstanding service to the RSL network and has been extensively involved in its development.

Victoria State Branch – Senior Marshall (Bands)

He has served the Victorian State Branch of the RSL as the Senior Marshall (Bands) for the ANZAC DAY March in Melbourne 1996-2002. This position includes liaising, coordinating, planning, and positioning of many bands of various sizes that take part in the march each year.

President Frankston RSL Committee

Kevin is currently the president of Frankston RSL Sub-Branch and has been the Committee member since 2008. He has served as Secretary from 2008 to 2015 and has been President from 2015 to the present day, 2022.

Additional Service Committees

Kevin's commitment and passion to the RSL community, and its veterans is shown in the time and effort he dedicates to the Frankston RSL and with RSL VIC. In addition to his role as President of the Frankston RSL, the largest Sub-Branch in Victoria, he also serves on other sub-committees, such as Veteran Welfare, and on the Commemorative Committee where he is instrumental in organising and executing the Anzac Day Service, Remembrance Day Service, and helping with both the Anzac and Poppy Appeals, that have raised a record breaking amount, in the history of Frankston RSL Appeals, of \$103,065.38 and \$66,155.27 respectively.

Service Career

Kevin served 28 years in the Royal Australian Navy, raising to the impressive rank of Lieutenant.





Further to helping veterans in need, Kevin has focused on Veterans, and their widows and families, who are socially isolated, and to this end works with the Wellbeing Officer to design regular outings to places like the Yarra Valley, HMAS CERBERUS Museum, Melbourne Aquarium, and Queenscliff.

OFFICIATING EVENTS

As President of the Frankston RSL, Kevin officiates many events - giving speeches and handing out awards. One such award that he is particularly proud of is the Anzac Spirit Award; he was recently asked to present the award to Sara Howie, who was voted by the Victoria Netball League Playing Group to receive the prestigious award for demonstrating Comradery, Others Before Self, and Courage.

COMMEMORATIVE SERVICES

Kevin officiates over and above his requirement at community organisations and official RSL services, and he also passionately organises and conducts Commemorative Services at sporting clubs, schools, and aged care facilities.

- 2016 – 2022 Initiated, planned, and conducted school and nursing home commemorations
- 2017-2022 Local sporting fields

VICTORIAN STATE BRANCH INVOLVEMENT

Since 2014 he has also taken on the volunteer role of the State Branch ‘Ceremonial Music Co-Ordinator’ where he also assisted the ANZAC House ‘Commemorations Office’ Team, by organising bands for those ceremonial events not covered by the ADF.

Kevin has served the Victorian State Branch of the RSL as the ANZAC Day ‘Senior Bands Marshall’ organising the bands for the ANZAC Day CBD March 1996-2022.

Building Development Frankston RSL

Kevin also contributed significantly to the current Frankston RSL Strategic Business planning that resulted in the recent development of the venue. Kevin’s commitment to the future of the club has always been growth. This growth would come by conducting strategic business planning seminars, involving all committee and senior managers, to outline the future of the club and its strategies for the next 5, 10, and 25 years.

He was heavily involved with the input into the design and development of Phase 1, 2, and 3 of the \$9M Frankston RSL refurbishment, increasing the venue to 3000m2 of space and cementing its position as the premiere destination club of Southeast Melbourne resulting in laying the foundations of exponential growth in all areas of club operations.



STRATEGIC PLANNING SESSIONS FRANKSTON RSL

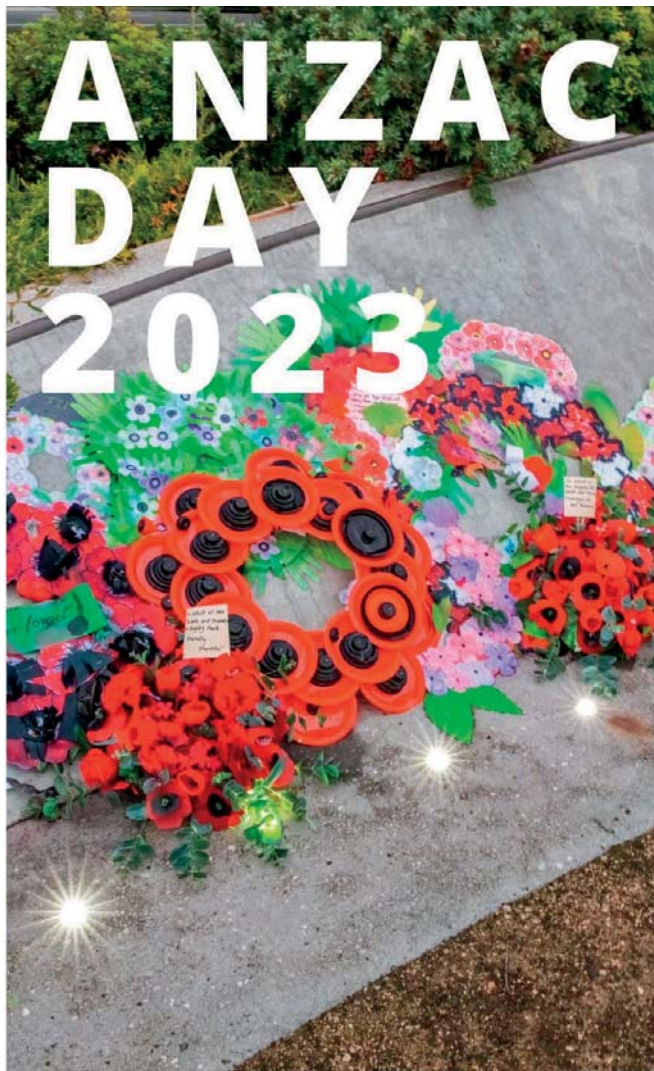
He has also been strategically involved in the bi-yearly strategic planning sessions at the Frankston RSL. These sessions were driven and in part hosted by Kevin, due to his commitment of the ongoing development of the RSL. These sessions have provided the strategic and conceptual basis for the Frankston RSL to become the biggest RSL in the network.

According to Rob Morrison, previous GM at Frankston RSL for 16 years, “ Kevin was always enabling the very workable arrangement between the Committee and Senior Management, resulting in the wonderful culture and customer service for the venue. He was instrumental in assisting with our growth in membership numbers and his unquestionable support for the Service Community”.

Over the years Kevin has overseen a very stable Committee which has contributed to the success of the Sub-Branch. During his involvement with the Frankston RSL Committee, Kevin has seen three Presidents, four Committee Secretaries, five Treasurers and 27 Committee members.

This amount was a surprisingly higher than anticipated amount given we were up against difficult fundraising circumstances; the downturn in the economy has meant that our generous customer base has less disposable income, in addition to the effects of Covid still present in our community - our Army Cadets were restricted to only selling one weekend due to a Covid outbreak amongst their ranks.

We were also challenged by the fact that in some shopping centres our volunteers were placed in less readily visible locations. In the end we are happy to report that it was a refreshingly successful Poppy Appeal and we are forever grateful to everybody who purchased from our volunteers.

A special mention about the volunteer assistance we receive from community groups and a big shout out to the Langwarrin Girl Guides, AirForce Cadets, and Army Cadets, who have selflessly offered their time over the years and without prompting.

Thank you!

The previous Appeals were very successful with our volunteer efforts raising over \$100,000.00 for the ANZAC Appeal (2022) and \$68,000.00 for the Poppy Appeal (2021). This was a record high in the history of the Frankston RSL. The success of these appeals can largely be attributed to the fact that everybody was more community minded post covid, and relieved to be 'out' and about.

We are moving more and more towards a cashless society, possibly thanks to Covid, with EFTPOS payment facilities being the norm these days. 35% of our payments during the 2022 ANZAC Appeal were made using credit cards, phones, and watches, and this percentage will keep increasing at the next Appeal. Well done to our volunteers - who may otherwise be technologically challenged, who learned a new skill and mastered electronic payments.

All funds collected go directly in support of veterans and their families who find themselves in necessitous circumstances and at the Frankston RSL, funds are also used in the prevention of social isolation with regular activities organised through our "wellness" programs.

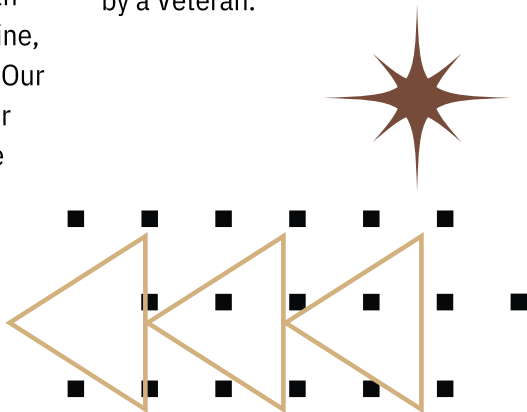
Welfare Mobility Team

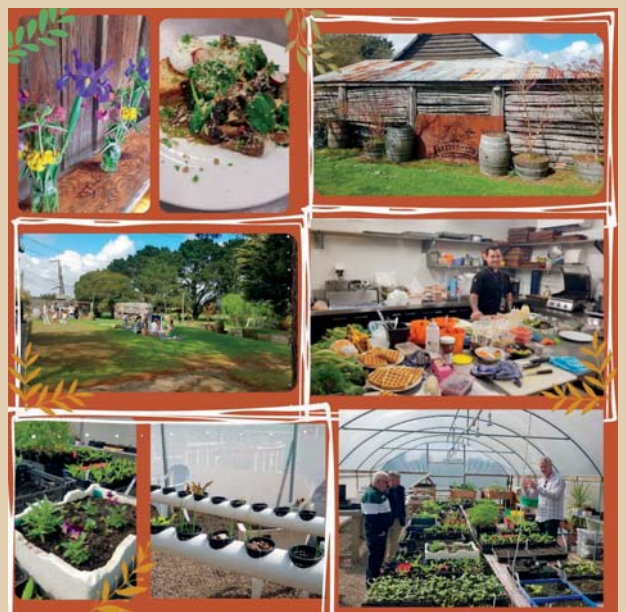

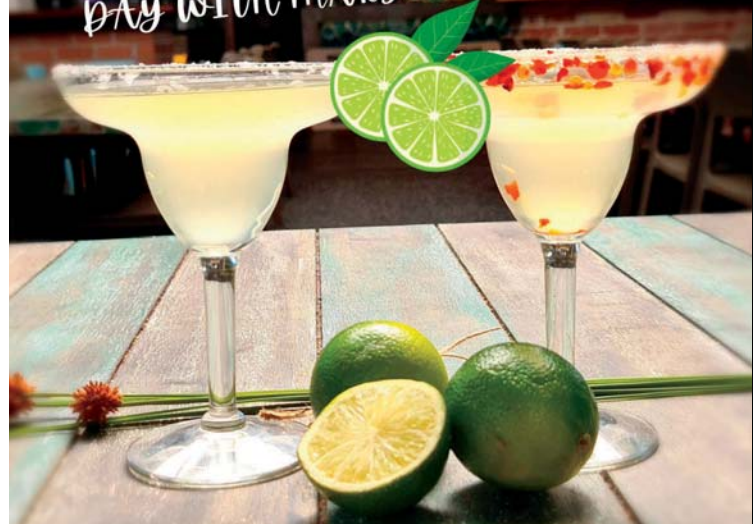

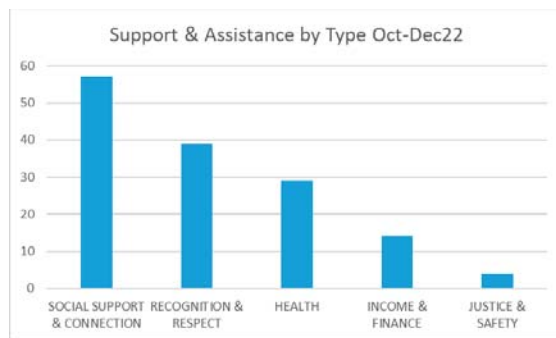

WELFARE UPDATE

October-December 2022

Our wellbeing team is always very busy with the provision of services and activities to Veterans and their families, from bus trips to managing queries about social activities, food vouchers to transport options, aged care information, or just to have a chat. Our Wellbeing Team was available to assist in 145 calls during this period - with 38 more Wellbeing Queries than last quarter and 87 of those being from members 81+, and 54 from 61-80 years. 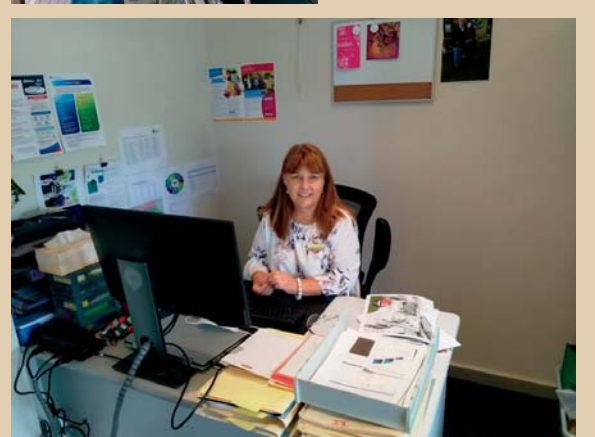

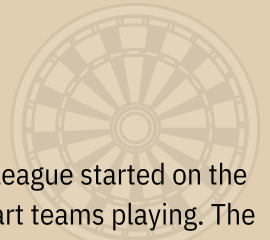

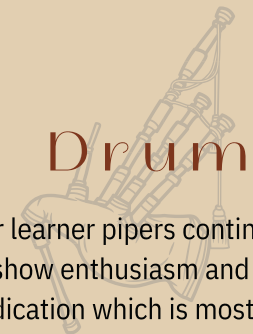
